Objectives and Activities

Summary of the objects of the charity set out in its governing document: The charity's objective is to build, and entirely finance the running of a school in Ethiopia for orphans and severely disadvantaged children

Summary of the main activities undertaken for the public benefit in relation to these objects: The school opened in March 2014, and at today's date (22.06.2015) has 150 children enrolled, with a further 50 due to start in September 2015. Phase II of the building programme commenced April 2015 and is due to be completed by September 2015.

Achievements and Performance

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year: 50 extra children were enrolled in September 2014 bringing the total to 150. A development program, consisting of 4 more classrooms, office, workshop and guardhouse, accommodation and an IT room, was instituted in November 2014, and construction commenced in April 2015. It is anticipated that this development ('Phase II') of the school will be completed in September 2015. Further extensive landscaping and gardening works have been carried out, and contracts have been entered into for the supply of a generator and a well/pump to ensure constancy of electricity and water supplies. St George's is now well established and is providing a superb high quality education to some of the most deprived children in Ethiopia

1. Basis of preparation

1.1 Basis of accounting
