Structure, Governance and Management

Type of governing document: Constitution

How the Charity is constituted: Charitable incorporated Organisation

Trustees selection methods: Appointed by existing trustees

Northwood African Education Foundation was registered with the charities commission on 12/8/2013. In 2014 St George's School, an NGO was established in Ethiopia, which is operating as the Ethiopian branch of the charity. They have their own bank account and are governed by the trustees of NAEF in London. Since November 2014 Northwood African Education Foundation has provided monthly grants to Northwood African Education Foundation (registered foreign charity in Ethiopia no. 3309) to fund the St George's education programme. The financial accounts for NAEF have been audited in Ethiopia under Ethiopian accounting requirements.

The construction of the school remains under the direction and funding of NAEF. Throughout the financial period, NAEF enjoyed a good working relationship with Link Ethiopia, an established UK charity who managed the building projects on our behalf.

Objectives and Activities

Summary of the objectives of the charity as set out in the governing document: The charities objective is to build, and entirely finance the running of a school in Ethiopia for orphans and severely disadvantaged children.

Summary of the main activities undertaken for public benefit in relation to these objectives: St George's School opened in Gondar in March 2014, and at today's date 6.6.17, has 250 children enrolled. In 2015/16 we concentrated on our sponsorship programme and as a result we are delighted and grateful that all the children at St George's are now funded under that programme. A further 50 children are enrolling in September 2017. The oldest children are now starting their fourth year at school. All the children come from extremely disadvantaged family circumstances and would not otherwise be in school. In addition to their education full uniform including underwear and shoes, stationery materials we are able to ensure that they are well fed daily in school and receive medical assistance when required.

During the financial year we undertook our phase II of the building, which was completed in May 2016. We are currently embarking on fundraising for Phase III of the building to provide a further four class rooms and additional facilities to accommodate the new intake of children.

Achievements and Performance

In 2015/16 we undertook our phase II of the building of a further four new classrooms, a new library, a computer centre; toilets for teachers and pupils; a guardhouse; some much needed storage space and a workshop. Grade 2 was thrilled to see their new rooms and the remaining two classrooms allowed for the September 2016 intake of children in Kindergarten. The school will continue to grow as the children move up through the grade and new pupils join and hence the need to start Phase III building to accommodate the next September intake. We have also landscaped the gardens and grow our own produce to help feed the children on site.

Now well established St George's is providing a high standard of education to some of the most deprived children in Ethiopia. Children are all provided with uniform and class room materials, free of charge. They receive two highly nutritious meals a day and basic healthcare. Our Grade 2 and 3 exam pass rate is 100%. Our attendance is above 94% across all grades, far higher than the Ethiopian average. Our dropout rate is 0% as all children who left have moved to different areas of the country and have not dropped out of school per se.

Fundraising

We are hugely grateful for all the support shown and for the wonderful fundraising activities which took place throughout the 2015/16 financial year. Our two established fundraisers, Carols by Candlelight and the Dragon Ball (for years 7 and 8 in South West London), were very successful and are growing in popularity. In February 2017 due to further donations, we were able to fund the remaining building costs relating to Phase II.

Northwood African Education Foundation is the nominated charity of the Broomwood Hall Ltd Parents Association. The parents have once again been a great source of support in raising significant amounts for the charity. In addition, the pupils of Broomwood Hall hold sales and sponsored activities In ald of NAEF.

Through a separate fundraising, we raised money towards a summer feeding programme, which ensured that the children continued to receive food and maintain their nutritional intake during the long summer recess.

Staff

The school currently has 18 academic staff and 21 ancillary staff. We are extremely grateful for the dedication of Hannah Dillon, our Director of Education, who has continued to be an outstanding inspiration, leading, managing and developing the school.

Plans for the future

We have preparations taking place to receive a new Intake of children in September 2017. As the children progress up through the school and new children join we will need more space and so our primary focus is on fund raising for Phase 3A of the building project. This will be a further 4 classrooms.

With continued support, we aim to extend facilities on the current site to provide around 700 children aged between five and 18 years of age, with the very best of education by 2022. Not only is St George's changing the lives of hundreds of children, but also the lives of their families and, in turn, the wider community.

1. Basis of preparation
